First Year

- Meet with the Career

- Create or update your resume
- Get involved in activities related to your interests

Second Year

- Research 2 or more careers that interest you
- Begin to network with

- ☐ Create a profile on LinkedIn

Third Year

- Do a mock interview to work on your interviewing skills

- Build an interview wardrobe, consider thrift stores

- Join a professional association related to your career interests
- Keep active in student organizations
- Consider graduate school, begin research

Fourth Year

- Complete and internship to gain relevant experience
- Update your resume with new experience and skills from third year
- □ Update LinkedIn
- Prepare a Cover Letter template that you can customize
- Establish professional references, store all their information, and seek letters of recommendation
- Research organizations you may want to work for, develop a list of 'prospective employers'
- Attend an off campus work/career fair
- If graduate school is your next step, work on applications and take any necessary entrance exams
- Develop a post-studies budget
- Mentor a first year student in your program
